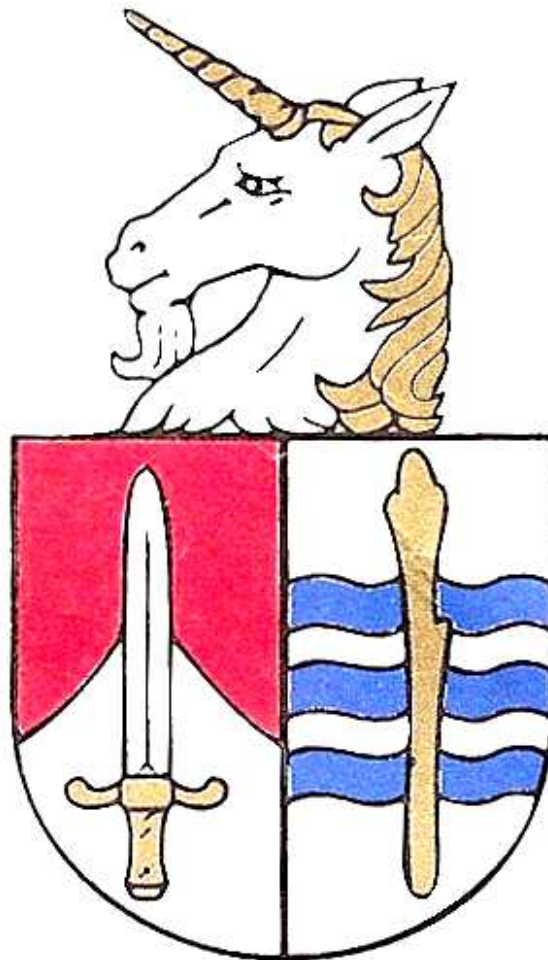

There are about 23,000 people residing within the boundary of this Council of which approximately 16,000 are registered electors.

The Precept from Cornwall Council for the year under review (2009/2010) was set at £206,771 representing an increase of 26.66% over the previous year. This equates to a sum of approximately £20.68 per household within the year of the Town Council. This money is allocated by Cornwall Council in the Council Tax and is then passed to the Town Council on demand. The Total Budget for the year under review (2009/2010) was set at £219,109. The Precept from Cornwall Council for the fiscal year (2010/2011) is set at £218,009 representing an increase of 5.43% over the year under review.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Year Under Review Councillor W G Jenkin, Mayor

The Full Council

April 2009

The council received a report from the Devon and Cornwall Police. Sgt Grigg spoke to his report. The number of dwelling burglaries in March 2009 showed a significant reduction from February 2009. He then spoke of policing issues in the three neighbourhood areas. A male had been arrested and charged with a number of the burglaries in February. The actual end of year criminal damage reduction figure was approximately 24%, the target was a 25% reduction. The detection result for the Camborne Sector was 29.9%, which is only 0.1% below the target. Members discussed the use of electronic recording equipment for meetings and it was resolved that the Clerk will investigate the legal implications of recording council meetings and report back to the Council. Councillor W G Jenkin was nominated as Mayor Elect and Councillor R J Beare was nominated Deputy Mayor Elect for the municipal year 2009/2010. Nominations were received for the Town Plaque awards for presentation at the Annual Town Meeting and Mr Tim Cocks from the Cornwall Fire Service was appointed as guest speaker at that meeting. The Council approved the appointment of a town handyperson to assist in the watering of the floral displays in the summer.

May 2009

The first business of the Annual General Meeting of the Council was to elect a Mayor and to appoint a Deputy Mayor for the municipal year 2009/2010. Councillor W G Jenkin was elected as the Mayor and Councillor R J Beare was appointed as Deputy Mayor. Councillor W G Jenkin read and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and then introduced his consort for the year, his wife Mrs Kate Jenkin. The retiring Mayor, Councillor Mrs Charman spoke of her year in office, a thoroughly enjoyable year as Mayor of Camborne and a most rewarding experience. The post should carry a government health warning for Lady Mayors, combining housework and civic duties can be very demanding! She began her year with The Royal Cornwall Show, staying on the show ground for the three days with the Town Clerk promoting Camborne. Twenty two Camborne organisations were represented. It was very successful in promoting Camborne, my thanks to the Clerk, Reg Bennett for making it possible. In June she went to Mexico for two weeks, at her own expense, to sign a treaty of friendship with the town of Pachuca, a very prestigious ceremony with children lining the streets waving flags and a gun salute. The purpose of the visit was to follow the route taken by Cornishmen in 1825, many of them from Camborne, referred to as The Great Trek. Miners crossed Mexico with a beam engine in order to pump out the flooded silver mines of Pachuca and Real del Monte. During her year in office she called four public meetings which were exceptionally well attended. Her charity events this year have been for The Children's Hospice South West and The Donald Thomas Centre. Through fundraising she has been able to present the Donald Thomas Centre with £2000 and the Children's Hospice South West with £1200. Finally she thanked everyone for their support, especially her husband, Lewis, for his

patience and support; my thanks to Councillor Jenkin for his support as deputy, thanks also to Councillor Collins, not only for his support but for always being at the end of the telephone. Special thanks to Councillors Mrs Hall and Ms Pascoe who have attended all five of her charity events.

Councillor Jenkin presented Councillor Mrs Charman, the retiring Mayor with a Town Plaque. Councillor Mrs Charman presented the town plaque awards and the Mayors award. She then presented a cheque for £1200 to the Precious Lives Appeal. Councillor Jenkin invited Mrs Godolphin to present the Sid Godolphin Youth Achievement Award and special merit award. This year's winner of the Sid Godolphin Youth Achievement Award was presented to Miss Abigail Roberts. Abigail, a pupil of Camborne Science and Community College and member of Camborne Youth Band had achieved much success and was very focused on her music and was always willing to support her school and the Youth Band in all events. A special award was presented to Miss Lani Anthony. Lani a pupil at St Meriadoc Infant School whilst swimming at Carn Brea Leisure Centre showed great maturity when one of her friends was at risk of getting into difficulties in deep water. She immediately swam out with a buoyancy aid and helped her to the side of the pool. Following the presentations Sub Officer Mr Cox of the Cornwall Fire Service gave a talk on the Phoenix project.

June 2009

The council received a report from Devon and Cornwall Police. Sgt Grigg spoke to his report and gave details of the OIS logs and crimes compared with the same period last year. He discussed policing issues in the three Neighbourhood areas and answered questions from members. He reported that Inspector Richard Hockin had taken over as Sector Commander at the end of April. Finally Sgt Grigg said that as a result of partnership with Redruth and Helston the shortage of a PCSO for Camborne North was to be addressed. The Council received a presentation from Mrs Sarah Mason and Councillor Sue Swift from the Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC) regarding the service provision of the organisation and the annual subscription. Councillor Beare relinquished his seat on the Amenities Committee as he is a member of that committee in the capacity of Deputy Mayor. Councillor Ms A Pascoe was appointed to the Amenities Committee. It was resolved that the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, the political group leaders and Councillor Mrs Hall be appointed to the standing orders working party. Councillors were appointed to the Sid Godolphin and Awards Working Party to be re named the Awards Working Party, and to the Standing Orders Working Party. The resignation of Councillor Jeff Wilson as a member of the Liberal Democrat Party was noted. It was resolved that the council would take no further action on the recording of meetings. Councillor A Sanders was appointed as the Council's representative to the Heritage Kernow Event. The response from Verity Bennett relating to elected member involvement with the Community Safety Partnership was noted.

July 2009

During the part of the meeting set aside for public participation members of the public raised their concerns and disappointment regarding the closure of the Trevu

Children's Centre. A report from Devon and Cornwall Police was received from Sgt Grigg which gave details of crime figures when compared with the same period last year. Policing issues in the three neighbourhood areas were discussed. Community Police Cadets were being involved in crime prevention initiatives he said. Inspector Hockin was keen to deal with alcohol related disorder earlier in the evenings to prevent further disorder and serious offences later. Constable Martin Horton had been identified as the new Neighbourhood Manager for Camborne West. Sgt Grigg then answered questions from members relating to Britain in Bloom judging day, the availability of cheap alcohol in the Town, anti social driving in Pendarves Road and the College Street area. It was resolved that Councillors representing the Council on outside bodies present a written report on meetings that they have attended to the relevant committee were appropriate. Councillor Beare was given permission to take the Deputy Mayor's badge to St Ann D'Auray in September 2009. The resignations of Councillors A C Bunce and E J Pope were noted. Councillor Mrs J Charman was appointed as this Council's representative to the Community Network Panel for this area. Members identified the Recreation Ground, rugby field and park and street cleaning with the appropriate funding as the two priorities for active partnering.

August 2009 – Recess

September 2009

The Council received a short presentation from Ms Sharon Eustice of the NHS Transforming Communities Services on the priorities set out for improving health in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly. Following this presentation members received the Devon and Cornwall Police report. Sgt Grigg said he was pleased that overall crime showed a slight decrease when compared with the same period last year. He then reported on the policing issues in the three neighbourhood areas. Officers continue to visit pubs late in the evening tackling alcohol related crime. Patrol officers are now being regularly tasked to the Camborne Town area to provide a presence. Constable Penaluna has now moved on to other duties and there was a vacancy for the Camborne North NBM role which it was hoped to fill soon. It was resolved that a letter of thanks be sent to the Chief Constable for the work of Constable Nigel Penaluna. Following his report Sgt Grigg answered questions from members. The Council received a presentation from Sgt Grigg relating to the new format proposals for PACT meetings. Sgt Grigg said he had sent a letter regarding the PACT (Partnership And Communities Together) meetings to the Town Council explaining that he was keen to develop the meetings to include not just the police but to involve the community and other agencies that would be able to address issues raised by the public. It was planned that there would be a public meeting every 6 months and panel meetings every 6 to 8 weeks. He suggested that a representative from each ward should be on the panel in addition to representatives from other agencies such as the Chamber of Commerce, Health, Fire Service etc. The Boundary Committee electoral review further consultation was received and it was resolved that the alternate proposals as set out in the further consultation is put forward as this Council's recommendation to the Boundary Committee for England.

October 2009

Mrs Juliet Jenkin, Honary Secretary of Camborne Redruth Hospital Guild of Friends gave a presentation on the work and history of the Guild of Friends. Sgt Grigg gave the police report detailing crime figures as compared with the same period last year and reported on the policing issues in the three neighbourhood areas. Constable Streatfield had been appointed the new Neighbourhood Beat Manager for Camborne North and will be working with Constable Horton (Camborne West). The 'No Drinking' order will be robustly enforced to prevent drink related ASB, and the use of the ASB process will increase to prevent such behaviour. Following his report Sgt Grigg answered questions from members. Members of the Council discussed the relationship of Town and Parish Councils with the Community Network Panels. The Council resolved to support The Cornish Declaration on climate change. The Designated Public Places Orders were discussed. It was resolved that Tolcarne Street, William Street, Moor Street, Rectory Road and Centenary Churchyard should be included within the Designated Public Places Order.

November 2009

Sergeant Grigg spoke to his police report. He gave the crime figures and OIS logs as compared with the same last year. Violent crime continued to be a priority he said. He then spoke of the policing issues in the three neighbourhood areas. Sgt Grigg explained the procedure for the issue of ASB orders, 85% of those served a stage 1 letter do not progress to stage 2. Following his report Sgt Grigg answered questions from members. The Mayor said that he had visited the police headquarters and call centre at Middlemoor and had spoken to the officer in charge of the call centre who he will invite to attend a meeting of this Council if members were in agreement. The budget for the financial year commencing 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011 was set at £225,909 with a precept upon Cornwall Council of £218,009. Reports were received from Cornwall Councillors. Councillor Mrs Charman was appointed as this Council's representative on the AAP steering group. Captain Graeme Mackay will be invited to the January meeting of the Council to explain the operational aircraft activities on this area.

December 2009

In the absence of Sergeant Grigg Acting Sergeant Andrews spoke to the police report. Sergeant Andrews explained the crime figures and OIS logs. Within those figures assaults had shown a slight increase as have burglaries. But he was pleased to report that 10 offenders have been linked to these crimes and have been arrested and are currently on police bail. He then reported on the three policing divisions of Camborne and the policing issues relating to those divisions. He then answered questions to members relating to officers patrolling the Town, planned cuts in services, police officers carrying out a census in the Town and other policing issues relating to Camborne. It was agreed that a working party consisting of Councillors Jenkin, Beare, Mrs Hall, Godolphin and Mrs Trengove be set up to work with Sergeant Grigg to set up the PACT process and list of invitees. A motion that this Council write to

Exeter prison enquiring if the prison is directing former prisoners to Camborne was received. The motion was carried by a majority vote. Members received reports from Councillor Beare on the meetings that he has attended as appointed representative to the Trevithick Day Committee and the Mayor's Parlour Campaign.

January 2010

In the absence of Sergeant Grigg, Acting Sergeant Andrews spoke to the monthly police report. Acting Superintendent Eastwood was also present and gave a presentation on the operations of police call centres. Crew Manager, Mr John Navin of the Camborne Fire Service gave the quarterly report. Councillors Mrs H Cullimore and S Odgers were appointed the Council's representatives to the Troon Adit Working Group. Councillor Mrs Hall was appointed the Council's representative on the Homeless Action Group. Members noted the response to the Council's letter to the HM prison service relating to Exeter Prison and the New Connection project. The Boundary Committee, electoral review of Cornwall final recommendations were noted. The Cornwall Council review of Designated Public Places Orders 2009/2010 with this Council's amendments was noted.

February 2010

Sergeant Grigg gave the monthly report on the work of the police in the Camborne area. Short reports were received from Cornwall Councillors representing Camborne. The procedure for sending out for information literature was discussed and it was unanimously resolved that the 'For Information' literature normally posted to members will now be electronically distributed to members with email facilities and the relevant papers will be sent by post to those members without email facility. Following the resolution from the July meeting regarding Town Council representative reports on their meetings with outside bodies it was agreed that members would submit a report or the minutes following every meeting of an outside body they attend as representatives of the Council. A letter from Cornwall Council regarding the updating of members interests was noted.

March 2010

Mr Mark James gave members an update on the Camborne Pool Redruth Community Network priorities. Sergeant Grigg spoke to the monthly police report. The condition of the Former Assembly Rooms building was discussed in depth. It was resolved that should a viable business plan be forthcoming for the purchase and refurbishment of the building the Council would support the financial requirements for its upkeep. It was confirmed that Councillors Godolphin, Mrs Hall and Mrs Trengove represent this Council on the Partners And Communities Together (PACT) executive. Councillor Mrs Hall reported on the Homeless Action Group (HAG) meeting she has attended as this Council's representative. Councillor Collins reported on the meeting he attended as the appointed representative to the Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC). The draft standing orders were received and certain amendments added. The standing orders would be forwarded to the next meeting of the Council for approval.

The Amenities Committee

April 2009

Members discussed the complaints of anti-social behaviour being experienced by a number of residents who live in close proximity to the bench in Troon Square. It was resolved that a large notice is placed in the notice board that is next to the bench advising that legal action would be taken if this behaviour persists. Members completed the consultation document on taxi provision in Cornwall. The revised grant offer from the Local Maintenance Partnership was noted. The location of the joint notice board with Carn Brea Parish Council adjacent to public footpath 40 in the parish of Camborne was noted. A copy of the letter requesting nominations for the Cornwall Best Village Competition will be displayed in the Towns notice boards to encourage nominations from Villages in the Camborne Parish.

May 2009

Councillor Mrs Hall was elected Chairman and Councillor Champion was appointed Vice Chairman for the municipal year 2009/2010. Members were appointed to the Camborne in Bloom Sub Committee, Christmas in Camborne Festival Sub Committee, Royal Cornwall Show Working Party, Heritage Centre Working Party, Footpaths and Countryside Working Party and other outside bodies. It was agreed that as a result of an email received relating to the withdrawal of the bus service along Weeth Road that the Council writes to First Bus conveying it's dismay at the decimation of the bus service. A report from the Clerk was received on grass cutting machinery and the Council's practice for the disposal of grass cuttings.

June 2009

Councillor Mrs Hall said that she has attended Royal Cornwall Show and was pleased with the interest shown by those attending the Camborne exhibition. She informed members of the resignation from the Town Council of Councillor John Pope. The strategy document relating to Public Art at Dolcoath was noted. Councillor Alan Sanders was appointed the Town Councils representative on matters relating to Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Members received the response from First Bus relating to this council's concern regarding the withdrawal of buses servicing the Weeth Road area in Camborne. A letter of thanks for the Council's involvement in the Royal Cornwall Show was received from Mr Tipple, Chief Executive of CPR Regeneration. Councillor Godolphin updated members on the planning inspectorate enquiry relating to the modification order for the footpath from Church View Road via Pavillion Park to Pendarves Street.

July 2009

The closure of the Trevu Children's Centre was discussed in detail. It was resolved that a letter be sent to Cornwall Council requesting the documentation at which the decision was made and to ask them to review their decision and request that they mothball the site to enable other interested organisations to gain independent surveys on the condition of the building with a view to securing this valuable asset for the Town. It was agreed that the damaged seat in Tregenna Lane be replaced with a seat currently in the Town Council store. Members discussed correspondence received regarding the loss of the bus service to Weeth Road and Treswithian Road.

August 2009 – Recess

September 2009

Members received a presentation on the floating support service of Stonham Tu dealing with housing related issues in this area. The First Devon and Cornwall bus service changes were noted. A report on the Camborne Produce Association was received from Councillor Godolphin as this Councils representative to that body. Members received the Camborne Produce Associations accounts for the year ended 31st March 2009. The notice of confirmation of the County of Cornwall addition of footpath from Church View Road via Pavillion Park to Pendarves Street, Tuckingmill, Camborne modification order 2008 was noted. An update report from the project manager of the Camborne, Roskear & Tuckingmill THI was received and the Clerk updated members on the re-instatement of the four faces of the Town Clock. Members received the resignation of Councillor Mrs Charman from the Christmas in Camborne Committee. Councillor Ms Waller was appointed as her replacement on the Christmas in Camborne Committee.

October 2009

Members received a presentation from Mr Colin Garrick, Rural Transport Project Manager, Cornwall Council on Shopmobility. The meeting received a presentation from Jade Smitheram a trader in Cross Street and other Cross Street Traders on their views to improve signage to Cross Street. The traders in Cross Street are of the opinion that the street is a unique trading area in Camborne and better signage could improve the footfall in that area. The Council agreed to support in principal the needs of the Cross Street traders. The budget heads for the fiscal year 2010/2011 were discussed and recommended to the Full Council for approval. Councillor Godolphin gave a report on the Camborne Produce Association AGM. The Clerk updated members on the maintenance of the Town Council bus shelters. The Town Market Manager's contract was received and a working party was set up to discuss and review the contents.

November 2009

The street market agreement was approved for the weekly Friday markets as recommended by the working party. Councillor Godolphin gave a report on the new committee structure and rental agreements of the Camborne Produce Association at Enys Road Allotments. He advised that a grant application to the National Lottery had been successful and that the money received had enabled the committee to build a new toilet block which has now been completed.

December 2009 – No meeting

January 2010

Mr Simmons gave members a presentation and update on the Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI) projects in Camborne. The possible retention of the phone kiosk located in the village of Penponds was discussed.

February 2010

Members discussed the request from the Penponds Village Association that this Council considers facilitating the retention of the phone kiosk at Penponds. A letter from Cornwall Council regarding the representation process relating to licensing of alcohol, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment was noted. Cornwall Council's 'The Fouling of Land by Dogs (Cornwall) Order 01/201' and 'The Dogs on Leads By Direction (Cornwall) Order 01/2010' was noted.

March 2010

Members received a presentation from Mr Alec Rice, projects manager (community education & fuel poverty) regarding the community education and fuel poverty campaign project at Parc an Tansys. Councillor Collins reported on the Cornwall in Bloom workshop that he had attended. Members approved a letter to be sent to UNESCO and copied to ICOMOS prepared by the Heritage Working Party. It was agreed that the Camborne Market Managers Agreement be continued for another 6 months.

The Budget & Development Committee

April 2009

Members received the statement of payments and receipts and bank reconciliation for the month of March 2009. Members noted the special meeting of the Budget and Development Committee to be held on Thursday 21st May at 7.00pm to receive the annual accounts and to complete the annual governance statement. It was resolved that the Risk Assessment Panel complete a security review for the council offices. It was resolved to invite a representative from the Cornwall Association of Local Councils to the next Full Council meeting to explain the benefits of the organisation and to explain their accounts. The CALC information services comprehensive area assessment from the audit commission was noted. Grants were awarded to Troon Methodist Church, Camborne Cadets Ceremonial Standards Appeal, Cornwall Brass Band Association and Shelter Cornwall.
