The King's Troop is coming!

Camborne Town council is thrilled to announce that the King's Troop will be returning to Camborne in September 2011. In 2010 Camborne gave the honorary freedom of the Town to the King's Troop Royal Horse Artillery and "thereby the right, privilege and distinction of marching through the town on all ceremonial occasions with colours flying, with drums beating and bands playing". The King's Troop will be exercising this right at 6pm on Thursday 22nd September 2011 when they will parade from Camborne Church down Treloar Warren Street to Centenary Chapel. Lots of people came to the event last year so the route of the parade has been made longer so that everyone can have a better view. So come and give them a proper Camborne welcome by cheering them on!

Mayor's Civic Service

The Mayor held his Civic Service on Sunday 10th April 2011 at Camborne Wesley Chapel. The traditional parade to the service did not take place this year because of the changed requirements for road closures. This year guests were asked to assemble outside Camborne Wesley before entering the chapel in procession for the service which was conducted by the Reverend David Bagwell. The emphasis was very much on the community as the congregation learned all about the work done by Street Pastors, Penhaligon's Friends and the future union of Wesley and Centenary Chapel services.



Trevithick Day

The sun shone as the streets of Camborne came alive on Saturday 30th April 2011 when the community came together to celebrate the town's industrial history. Thousands packed into the town centre for a day of entertainment and attractions. The highlights of the day were the children's and adults' dances and the parade of steam engines.

A civic reception attended by George Eustice MP and dignitaries from nine local councils was held in the Council offices. The Mayors, Chairmen and their partners were delighted to be invited to join the parade at the front of the afternoon dance led by Mr Kingsley Rickard and the Mayor. They spent the rest of the afternoon enjoying the entertainment and many colourful stalls before marvelling at the impressive parade of steam.

CCTV

CCTV monitoring in West Cornwall ceased on 31st March 2011 because not enough Councils agreed to fund the amount demanded by Cornwall Council to continue the service. Camborne, Hayle and St Ives Town Councils had agreed to pay Cornwall Council the required amount and were concerned to learn that the service would be stopped. As a result the three Councils got together to explore the possibility of providing their own CCTV monitoring service.

In April 2011 Camborne Town Council approved a joint agreement to secure and enter into a three year contract to provide a minimum of twenty hours CCTV monitoring a week. Since then Redruth and Helston Town Councils have also approved the joint agreement and Penzance Town Council is considering the proposals. This is good news as the additional revenue from the other towns means that we will be able to provide more monitoring hours. It is hoped that continued CCTV monitoring will help keep our streets safer by acting as a deterrent and provide better quality evidence to the police when seeking prosecution.



Guided walk around Camborne

On 21st May 2011 Mr David Thomas, Cornwall Council Archivist, led a guided walk around Camborne for members of the Council and the Heritage Sub Committee. The walk had been intended to help identify heritage buildings in the town that were worthy of listed status but it turned out to be much more than that. Mr Thomas' extensive local knowledge gave everyone a vibrant picture of Camborne's past through not only the buildings but also the people. In fact, it was so interesting that there was not enough time to finish the walk! As a result David will be leading us around the second part of the walk on 2nd September 2011. Members of the public are welcome to come along and experience bygone Camborne and its people.

Annual Meeting and Annual Town Assembly



The Council held its Annual Meeting and Annual Town Assembly on 12th May 2011. Councillor Jeff Collins was elected Mayor and Councillor Mrs Jean Charman appointed Deputy Mayor for 2011/12. Councillor Collins and other Councillors paid tribute to the retiring Mayor, Councillor John Beare, for leading the Council with determination and dignity through a challenging year. The Council also thanked the retiring Mayoress, Sue, who was presented with a bouquet of flowers. Councillor Beare responded by thanking his fellow Councillors for their support and said that the King's Troop visit in July 2010 had, for him, been the highlight.

Members were appointed to Committees and as representatives to organisations outside Camborne Town Council.

The Annual Town Meeting was very well attended by members of the public, with standing room only at the back! Councillor Beare presented a personal cheque for £500 to Gwen Bentley, Branch Chairperson of the Mid Cornwall Branch of Parkinson UK. The charity is very close to Councillor Beare's heart as his father suffered with Parkinson's disease for over twenty years.

Aaron Thomas from Troon CP School was presented with the Sid Godolphin Achievement Award for his dedication and talent in all aspects of his work as well as his fundraising efforts for charity. The Council also awarded certificates of achievement to Mathew Griffiths, Camborne Community College and Megan Burrige, Rosemellin CP School.

Town plaques were awarded to Barrie Bawden, Coach for the under 12s Rugby team at Camborne RFC; Kingsley Rickard, Chairman of the Trevithick Society; Ivor Corkell, Chairman of the Old Cornwall Society and Councillor Charles Bickford for serving two terms as a Camborne Town Councillor.

Councillor Beare presented the Mayor's award to Mr Treve James MBE for his work in the community over forty years at Fairholme Children's Home, New Connection and more recently All Saints Church Community Centre. Treve has been the driving force behind the transformation of a near derelict building to a thriving community centre and has also helped secure funding of over £1 million pounds for community projects in Camborne.

Everyone present cheered the members of Camborne RFC's under-12s team who were presented with certificates of achievement for their victory in the 2010 championship (beating Redruth!!!).

The good atmosphere continued as Mr David Thomas entertained everyone with his fascinating insight into Camborne one hundred years ago.
