

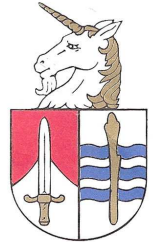

The King's Troop

Thousands of people packed the centre of Camborne to see the King's Troop Royal Horse Artillery mark its official acceptance of the freedom of the Town. Riders in full uniform passed proudly along Church Street and into Trelowarren Street to cheers and warm applause from a large and enthusiastic crowd. The riders stopped near the Town Square where Captain Max Chenery accepted the honorary freedom of Camborne from the Mayor, Councillor John Beare. Mr Beare welcomed everyone to the celebration and stressed that the award to the troop was "in recognition and appreciation of the fundamental role of Her Majesty's Armed Forces during both times of conflict and peace".

We are a Fairtrade town!

Camborne has been awarded **Fairtrade** status by the Fairtrade Foundation. The Fairtrade Foundation accredits fair trade and is the only guarantee of International Fairtrade Certification. The Fairtrade mark **guarantees** in the developing world:

- Farmers a fair and stable price for their produce
- Farmers and plantation workers the opportunity to improve their lives
- Greater respect for the environment and a sustainable future
- A closer link between consumers and producers
- Small farmers a stronger position in world markets
- Equality of opportunity and basic Human Rights
- Workers rights to organise.

Camborne is the only town in Cornwall other than Truro and Falmouth to have achieved Fairtrade status and this award which reflects the strong values of our town.



Twinning Reception

Camborne Town Council and Camborne Twinning Association hosted a joint event on the 10th September to present the Bond of Friendship to representatives from Calumet, Michigan, USA. The Bond was presented by Councillor Mrs Charman to Mrs Jean Ellis; we hope to build on the strong historic links between the two towns to the benefit of both communities in the future.

Full Council

Members received the quarterly report from the Fire Service and monthly reports from the Police.

Councillors discussed the proposed closure of the Court Service in Camborne. Members believed that centralising court services in Truro would make it more expensive and difficult for some of the poorest and most vulnerable people in Cornwall to access justice. The members responded to the consultation by opposing the closure.

The terms of the Council's lease and the insurance implications were considered in relation to use of the building by external organisations. Councillors resolved, with much regret, that no outside body could use the Town Council office or gain access to the Magistrate's Court for the time being; it was hoped that solutions to the current problems would soon be found.

The proposed boundary changes which would result in a constituency which crossed the Cornwall and Devon borders were considered and it was agreed to send a letter of support to Saltash Town Council for their campaign opposing the boundary changes.

Planning Committee

In July 2010 a total of twelve planning applications were considered; twenty seven were considered by the Committee in September. Members noted Cornwall Council planning decisions and resolved to send a letter to Cornwall Council opposing the proposals for the A30 Treswithian Interchange.

Members discussed street naming proposals for the developments at Boilerworks Road, the site off Trevu Road and roads on the Dolcoath Development.

The Committee responded to the Cornwall Council consultation on the draft sex establishment policy by recommending a zero limit in the commercial area of the Town.

Budget and Development Committee

Members received statements of payments, receipts and bank reconciliations for the months of June, July and August 2010 and the first quarter VAT return. They also received the external auditor's certificate and opinion for the year ended 31st March 2010. **It was agreed that an interim six month audit should be carried out and that the Scribe 2000 Ltd licence should be renewed.**

It was resolved to part exchange the current Council Land Rover and to replace the current photocopier in the office for a new upgraded design. A quote to dig five pits to install cables to supply electricity for the Christmas lighting displays from lamp standards in the Town was approved.

Members received confirmation of acceptance of the post of Town Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer from Mrs Amanda McClure.

Grants Awarded

Camborne Christmas Lights Committee, Citizens Advice Bureau Cornwall (Camborne Office), OAK, Camborne Music Festival and Camborne Trevithick Day.

Amenities Committee

In July members received a presentation and update on the Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI) projects in Camborne from Mr Caius Simmons, Cornwall Council. It was resolved that Councillors S Cullimore, Ms A Pascoe, A Sanders and M Champion and interested parties from local organisations would form a Working Party to consider future St Piran's Day celebrations in Camborne. Members also resolved to support the Mineral Tramways Project in principal.

In September the renewed agreement for the street market in Camborne was received. The Committee agreed to send a letter to the All Saints Church, Tuckingmill to support their fundraising efforts for repairs to the church.
