There are about 22,000 people residing within the boundary of this Council of which approximately 16,000 are registered electors.

The Precept from Kerrier District Council for the current fiscal year is set at £160,663.00. This equates to a sum of approximately £18.90 per household within the year of the Town Council. This money is allocated by Kerrier District Council in the Council Tax and is then passed to the Town Council on demand. The Precept for the past fiscal year was in the sum £154,561.00.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Year Under Review

Full Council

The year under review started with the erection of new signs at both the east and west entrances to the town commemorating the town's twin town of St Anne d'Auray in Brittany. At the April meeting of the full council a presentation was received from Mrs Marna Blundy and her team from the West Cornwall Healthwatch setting out their concerns at the proposals to downgrade the facilities at West Cornwall Hospital. Also at that meeting members resolved to support the commemoration of the Queen's Golden Jubilee. Allotment holders at Pengegon met with the amenities committee in April asking for support for their allotments to be made statutory. A special meeting of the council was called in mid April to hear representatives from the West Cornwall Primary Care Trust speak on their proposals for revised services to West Cornwall Hospital.

May saw the election of Councillor John Beare as Mayor. Following the Annual General Meeting of the Council the Annual Town Assembly heard a talk from the Objective one taskforce.

In June members discussed the problem of abandoned vehicles. A letter was sent to the Police Authority asking that more stringent checks are made on the previous owners of these vehicles. At this meeting the council resolved to present small plaques to all schools in Camborne commemorating the Queen's Golden Jubilee. Once again the council wrote to the Passenger Rail Authority complaining about the reduction of rail services to the town. June saw the start of the floral display project for this year. After a very cold beginning the flowers recovered well and the usual impressive display was there for all to see.

July saw the confirmation of funding committed by the town council in the sum of £30,000 towards the new Town Council Office. The office will form part of a joint venture project that the town council has formed with Cornwall County Council and the Magistrates Court Service. This facility will be in Basset Road with the Council having the use of the magistrates court in the evenings. It is hoped that the project will be finished by August 2003 and that the first council meeting will be held there in September. The amenities committee heard presentations from Mr Fergus Murray from the Cornwall Neighbourhoods for change regarding the North Kerrier Street Warden project and from Station Officer Kevin Thomas on the new community safety centre at Camborne Fire Station.

Following the August recess the September meeting of the Full Council was attended by residents of William Street who made their views known over the issues of people who work in the town using William Street to park their vehicles. Police Inspector Simon Selley who was present at the meeting registered their concerns and promised to attend to the matter. Also at this meeting a group of residents from Rectory Road expressed their concerns at the Skateboarders using the road outside their homes as a skateboarding area. They had contacted the Police and the divisional surveyor at county highways and were now asking the council to help. A donation of £5000 was made to the Camborne Redruth minor injuries unit appeal at this meeting. Support was also given to the retention of staffing at the toilets in Gurney's Lane.

The October meeting of the Amenities Committee heard a talk from Ms Mel Jackson on the new legislation relating to licensing matters.

November saw the setting of the budget for the year 2003/2004. Although the budget rose by 7.9 % the precept was held to 3.95%. At this meeting the Council resolved to install a plaque on a seat in the town square to the memory of the well known local entertainer Lilla Miller (who's stage name was Mrs Rosewarne) who had died earlier in the month. Members also adopted the policy to support the lesser-known languages in Europe.

Following a meeting in Devon attended by National Association of Local Councils Officers the council adopted its commitment to insuring that it complies with the regulations set out in the Race Relations (Amendment) Act 2000. December saw commitment by the council to produce a book of local circular walks promoting the area.

Fly Posting issues were discussed at the January meeting of the Council. It was resolved that clubs pubs and other entertainment venues be asked for their co-operation in preventing this unsightly practice. At the January meeting of the Budget and Development committee members heard a presentation from Acorn Marketing on their proposals for a web site design for the council. The proposals were very comprehensive covering all aspects of the council's work. The quote received was below others received for comparative work. Following the presentation Acorn Marketing were commissioned to create a web site for the council.

The future of the Camborne School of Mines Museum was a cause for debate at the February meeting of the full council. The resulting resolution asked that the CSM explore further funding to allow the geological collection to be available for public inspection and remain in Camborne. Nine bus shelter sites have been identified in Camborne. The amenities committee have held negotiations with Adshell and Kerrier planners to discuss the provision of this facility. An update of these talks was received at the February meeting of the Amenities Committee.

During the year under review the Amenities Committee formed a playground working party with a remit to inspect all playgrounds in the town council's administrative area. This working party meets regularly, and in February conducted a survey into the needs for playground equipment in Beacon. The results of that survey are currently being formulated.

The heritage centre working party is awaiting the recommendations from the appointed consultants to this project. The possibility of a joint venture with other projects and voluntary groups is currently being investigated.

By the time this report is published elections will have been held. Several councillors are not seeking election and others may not be in post. A warm welcome is given to new councillors and a sincere debt of gratitude is extended to all who have served in the life of the council past.

The Committee opposed applications relating to the Penwith housing development at

Roskear, the Orange base station at Holmans, Change of use of nursery to sawmill at Treswithian and the orange base station at Penponds.
