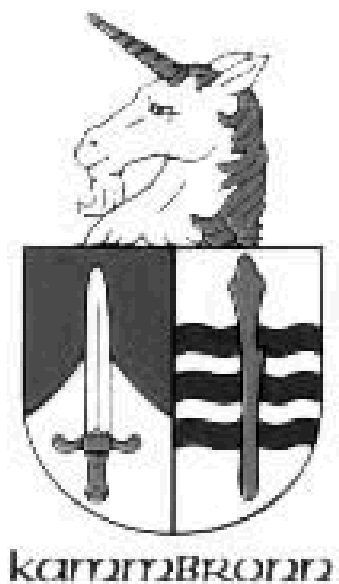

There are about 22,500 people residing within the boundary of this Council of which approximately 16,300 are registered electors.

The Precept from Kerrier District Council for the current fiscal year is set at £156,186 representing a reduction of 5.62% over the previous year. This equates to a sum of approximately £19.52 per household within the year of the Town Council. This money is allocated by Kerrier District Council in the Council Tax and is then passed to the Town Council on demand. The Precept for the year under review was in the sum £165,479.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Year Under Review

The year under review

April

The Full Council

At the Full Council Councillor E J Pope was elected Mayor for the ensuing year, Councillor S Cullimore was appointed Deputy Mayor. Both Councillors would take office at the AGM of this Council in May. Members received reports on the Mayors Parlour Group Campaign in support of the West Cornwall Hospital A & E Department; a statement from the Probation service on sex offenders housed at Meneghy Hostel; a delegation of Japanese business men in Camborne to celebrate Trevithick Day; Royal Mail delivery times. Councillors Mrs Curtis, A J L Bunt and D Tellam were appointed to a working party to assess and formulate a reply to the Future of Travel and Transport in Cornwall consultation.

The Amenities Committee

The Amenities Committee received a presentation from Mr Martin Scane from the 'Get your boots on' project. This project, centred around Carn Brea Leisure Centre was to promote a national scheme entitled 'walking your way back to health'. The Committee also approved funding for play equipment at Beacon Playing Field; received an update on the progress of the Mobile Skate Park Initiative from Kerrier and discussed the production of a new Town Guide for 2005. There was one grant application.

The Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. The internal auditors report; a report from the Clerk regarding the ownership of the town clock mechanism and the confirmation of the order for the Town Notice Board to be sited outside the Council office in Basset Road were also received. Eight grant applications were considered.

The Planning Committee

Twenty eight planning applications were received in April. The naming of a development at Mount Pleasant Road, Camborne, 'Godolphin View' was also discussed.

May

The Full Council

At the Annual General Meeting of the Town Council, Councillor E J Pope took office as Mayor for the ensuing year. At the Annual Town Assembly that followed the Annual General Meeting Town Plaques was presented to Mr Gladwyn Fisher for his work as Treasurer of the Camborne Produce Association; Mrs Dorothy Fisher for her work for the RSPCA; Mr & Mrs Joll for their work at both the Gladys Holman Home and Dove House; Mr David Oates for his work as a local historian; The Camborne Town Youth Band on becoming National Youth Band Champions of Great Britain; Mrs Freda Waterhouse wife of Councillor Cyril Waterhouse, the Mayor until January 2004, who sadly and unexpectedly died in office, received the plaque in his memory. A plaque was also presented to Councillor R J Beare the retiring mayor who took over as Mayor following the death of Councillor Waterhouse. Mr Sam Bartle received the Sid Godolphin Youth Achievement Award for his excellent progress both academically and in sport. Dr Tim Williams, the Chief Executive of the Urban Regeneration Company gave a talk on the Camborne Regeneration plans.

The Amenities Committee

Councillor Mrs S Curtis was elected Chairman; Councillor J P Collins was appointed Vice Chairman. A letter of support for a play area at Kehelland was discussed as was updates on bus shelters, floral displays and the mobile skatepark initiative. Retention of memorial stones from the Camborne School of Mines and the closure of Troon surgery were also debated. Three licence applications were received.

The Budget & Development Committee

At the Budget & Development Committee meeting held on the last day of April a statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. The purchase of an electric winding mechanism to the town clock and night silencer for the bell was approved. There was no objection to Camborne Twinning Association's request to fly the Breton flag during the visit of the Twin Town of St Anne d'Auray in May. Confirmation was received of a promotions and marketing grant from CPR Regeneration. Four grant applications were considered.

The Planning Committee

Councillor Mrs H Cullimore was elected Chairman of the Planning Committee and Councillor Mrs C Trengove was appointed Vice Chairman. Twenty planning applications were received. Other matters discussed were a notice of appeal at 30 Manor Road for Mr & Mrs Roberts, temporary road closures at New Connection Street and Chapel Hill, Brea.

June

The Full Council

During the section of the meeting set aside for public participation Mr G Le Hunte, Chairman Camborne Chamber of Commerce addressed the meeting on matters relating to the 2005 Town Guide, council representation at Chamber meetings, the poor state of the Town and the ladies toilets in Gurneys Mews. Members also discussed changes to bus services by First Bus.

The Amenities Committee

Members discussed the installation of new street lighting, a letter of support to Camborne Community Childcare and the provision of a Camborne Young Peoples Centre in Adelaide Street. Three Licence applications were received.

The Budget & Development Committee

Councillor C Bickford was elected as Chairman and Councillor R J Beare appointed Vice Chairman. A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. The conditions and terms of employment of the staff was referred to the Staffing Sub Committee, the annual accounts of the Camborne produce association were received. Two grant applications were considered.

The Planning Committee

Twenty planning applications were received. Other matters considered were the implementation of a 20 mph speed limit order for Pengegon, the naming of developments in both Cornish and English.

July

The Full Council

In July the Council received an update from the planning committee on the naming of developments in both English and Cornish. The Clerk reported on his progress on his AQA qualification and quality council status. A report from the CCC Independent Remuneration Panel was also received. Security measures at the Magistrates Court whilst the Council was in session were also discussed.

The Amenities Committee

Members received a presentation from a member of the Kerrier Splash team. Updates from the Bus Shelter Committee, the Town Square sub committee and the playground sub committee, the Kerrier & Fal Credit Union. A report from the Flower Partnership Working Group was also received.

The Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. Seven grant applications were considered. Matters were discussed relating to a report from the Clerk on the Town Land Rover, a mezzanine floor in the Town Council's store, a free trial for a postage franking machine, the purchase of a speed gun. The annual audit was received and approved and the Town Council's Risk Assessment was received and approved.

The Planning Committee

Twenty seven planning applications were received. Other matters were discussed including the adoption of footpaths at Boscarth Close and Vellan Close, Barripper and Footpath 24 Penponds to Town Boundary.

August - recess

The Planning Committee

Twenty one planning applications were received. Other matters discussed were proposed junction improvements at Cadogan Road/Mount Pleasant junction, road safety at Barripper, a consultation re proposed telecommunications development at the telephone exchange Wellington Road, Camborne.

September

The Full Council

At the September meeting of the Full Council it was agreed to call a public meeting to address the problems of Anti Social Behaviour. Representatives from the Police, the Youth Service, KDC and the URC were to be invited. Following the move of Camborne School of Mines to Penryn, the school asked the Town Council for sites for the relocation of the Basset and Memorial Stones. Also discussed was an alcohol ban for The Spinney

The Amenities Committee

The bus shelter for Treswithian was installed, however members noted that the shelter for Troon had been delayed due to a dispute over ownership of the site proposed for the shelter. Members discussed a request from Camborne Science and Community College for the Council to participate in work experience schemes. Beacon playground was to be equipped with new toddler play equipment. It was agreed that the Town Council would again purchase the main Christmas tree for the Town Square.

Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. Five grant applications were considered. Members discussed matters relating to the possible relocation of and upgrading of CCTV cameras, and a training programme for the Clerk arranged by the CALC.

The Planning Committee

Forty Four planning applications were received and considered. Other matters discussed related to environmental enhancements to Church Lane, Gurneys Lane and Tyacks Lane, temporary road closure from Chapel Hill to Condurrow Road, Brea and the possible modification of footpath 24.

October

The Full Council

At the full meeting of the Council members discussed the problems relating to the siting of a bus shelter in Troon and the possibility of holding a meeting in Troon to help resolve the problems.

The Amenities Committee

October is the month when budgets are prepared for the following fiscal year. The Committee was able to offer savings of £1000 from the current budget to be carried forward as savings to reduce the need in the following year. Members also noted the improvements to Treslothan War Memorial.

The Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and the VAT return was received. The budget heads for the fiscal year 2005/2006 were recommended. The Committee recommended a budget of £199,774.00 to the Full Council. The Clerk reported that Camborne had been chosen to represent Cornwall in the BBC's 'Walk in Time' project.

The Planning Committee

Thirty three planning applications were received and considered. Other matters discussed related to temporary road closures at Dolcoath Crossing and Park Holly, Section 38 agreements at Tremayne Park and Weeth Road, the adoption of the replacement Cornwall Structure Plan, a planning consultation event to be hosted by KDC in November, the proposed modification of the footpath from Mill Road to Bridleway 62 Penponds and approving this Committee's budgets 2005/2006.

November

The Full Council

At this month's Full Council meeting the precept to Kerrier District Council was agreed at £156,186.00 a reduction of 5.62% on the previous year. The budget was set at £199,774 a reduction of 1.62% from last year. Other matters considered by members was the annual meeting between KDC and Parish and Town Councils, the proposed removal of the fire service control centre out of Cornwall and presentations from Peninsular Radio and Kerrier Fal Credit Union

The Amenities Committee

Members considered the addition of a footpath from Pendarves Street, Tuckingmill via Pavilion Park to Church View, the KDC play area review, a request from Pirate FM for a letter of support for its bid for a new licence.

The Budget and Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts and bank reconciliation were received. Three grant applications were considered. The purchase of additional Town Council pin badges and the funding of a Mayor's award for private householder Christmas decorations.

The Planning Committee

Twenty Five planning applications were received and considered. Other matters discussed included the naming of a development in Gurneys Lane, Gurneys Court, temporary road closure at Lower Pengegon, proposed junction improvement at Cadogan Road/Mount Pleasant Road, Beacon that was abandoned and bridge strengthening work at Praze-an-Beeble.

December

The Full Council

At the December meeting of the Full Council members were updated on the situation relating to the siting of a bus shelter for Troon. A representative was appointed to attend the West Cornwall Community Network Conference at St Ives in January.

The Amenities Committee

Members received a report on the mobile skate park, the maintenance implications for street furniture, a request for support for Kerrier Splash and Kellogg's Corn Flakes Great Walk 2005 proposed for Camborne Park and Recreation Ground.

The Planning Committee

Eleven planning applications were received and considered in December. A proposal from CCC for a Loading Bay in Commercial Street was also discussed.

January

The Full Council

Members heard from Mrs Cocup who explained her involvement with a school and orphanage in Sri Lanka and the devastation following the Boxing Day Tsunami. Members then discussed the possible ways of fundraising for the Asian Disaster Appeal resolving to organise a concert later in the year. Under local government law Councils are forbidden to donate monies from the public purse to national or international disasters. Highway matters and the Troon bus shelter was also discussed as was the implications of a possible downgrading of the Fire Station at Camborne.

The Amenities Committee

At the January meeting a presentation was received from Mrs Melissa Ralph and the team from Kerrier on the implications regarding the maintenance requirements of the new street furniture. Members also resolved that this Council support the THI initiative in the sum of £19,500 over 3 years. A request for match funding for the installation of new swings at Beacon Playing Field was also considered and approved.

The Planning Committee

Sixteen planning applications were received and considered. Other matters discussed included temporary road closure at Church View Road, from the B3303 to Stennack. Members also received a petition from residents in Fore Street Penponds relating to parking problems.

February

The Full Council

Members received a reply from Kerrier regarding the naming of streets and developments in both Cornish and English. The possibility of councillors falling into line with Cornwall County Councillors and being police checked was also discussed. An update on the Clerk's progress on his AQA examination and the future of the Holman Rock Drill collection was received.

The Amenities Committee

Members heard a talk from Mr Stuart Wallace and Mr James Hills on the Kerrier and Penwith Liveability Project. Updates on the Mineral Tramways and Public Realm works were also received. The workload of the Town Handyman was reviewed and Kerrier Direct Services were to be contacted with a request for assistance for the handyman in cleaning certain areas of the Town.

The Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts, bank reconciliation and monitoring report was received. Seven grant applications were considered. Matters relating to the Town Guide 2005 publication; a report from the internal auditor; a quote for pin badges and the sending of council literature to the Cornish community in Australia were also discussed.

The Planning Committee

Twenty six planning applications were received and considered. Other matters discussed included proposed cycle and pedestrian route in Church Lane and the Portreath Branchline Trail.

March

The Full Council

The Mayor reported that he and the Clerk had viewed the Holman artefacts which were in storage near Helston. They were awaiting the views of two local industrial engineers who were to give their opinion on the value of the collection to the Town. It was noted that the Town artefacts of note that were previously on display in the Town Library were being moved to Helston museum where they would be stored until a suitable site in Camborne is found for their display. Membership and policies relating to the Sid Godolphin Award and Town Plaque awards were considered. It was resolved to continue to support the Mayors Parlour Team at Penzance in its aim to retain an A & E department at West Cornwall Hospital. Support was also given for the retention of the RAF base at St Mawgan.

The Amenities Committee

The price structure and logistics for the 2005 floral displays were discussed and approved. The playground working party continued its support in match funding with Kerrier the provision of play equipment within the Town Council administrative area. The siting of the Basset Memorial and Husband stones from the former School of Mines building was discussed and agreed that they would be placed in Trevithick Road.

The Budget & Development Committee

A statement of payments and receipts and bank reconciliation was received. One grant application was considered.

The Planning Committee

Twenty five planning applications were received and considered. Other matters received included restriction of waiting orders in Church Lane, temporary prohibition of traffic in Vyvyan Street, Trelowarren Street and Dolcoath and Lower Penegon.
